HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES

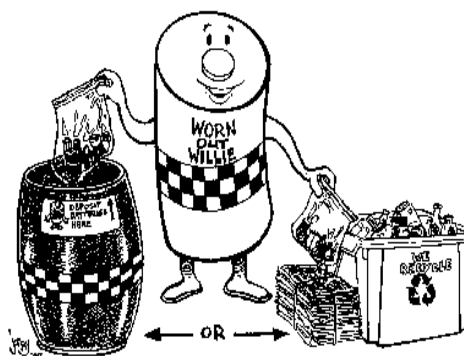
Household batteries are collected in curbside recycling programs and drop-off depot recycling sites throughout Warren County.

Batteries should be placed in plastic baggies and kept away from children.

Batteries are collected because they should not be burned in an incinerator or land-filled and some batteries are recyclable.

Also, some rechargeable appliances should not be put into the trash because they contain nickel-cadmium batteries, which are not to be removed. When these appliances are worn out they should be disposed of on Household Hazardous Waste Cleanup Day(s), as advertised.

Note: Lead Acid batteries are **NOT** accepted.
